10.00 School Visit - <u>De Werkplaats - Kindergenmeenschap</u>, Utrecht The Workshop Children's Community is a primary and secondary school, based on four core values: cooperation, equality, participation and sustainability. The school was founded in 1926 by Kees Boeke and was known as an experimental school. The (former) Queen Beatrix attended the school. At De Werkplaats, Boeke tried to reinvent education by letting children in on decisions concerning school. He designated school as a workshop, teachers as employees and pupils as workers. The goal of this form of education was to teach children a sense of democracy.
